


POLITICAL PUBLIC OPINION OF MONTENEGRO June, 2021



Sample

- The sample is representative for all citizens over 18 years
- Total of 1037 of respondents participated in the research survey
- Sample: double stratified with random selection of respondents within defined enumeration areas
- Standard statistical error is +/-3.1 % for the appearances with incidence of 50% with interval of trust of 95%
- Post stratification was performed by gender/sex, age and national affiliation
- Research was conducted in the period from 5 to 12 August, 2021






The performance of Zdravko Krivokapić's Government- %






The performance of Government sum: very and mostly satisfied – trend (%)







The share of the highest rating (5) for politicians - %




Average rating for politicians on a scale from 1 to 5 - (%)




Performance of the ministries in the previous period sum: very and mostly good (%)




If parliamentary elections were held next week, which party would you vote for? (% of committed)




If parliamentary elections were held next week, which party would you vote for? (over 1% - trend)








Whether it is necessary to call early parliamentary elections-%*






Support for Montenegro's accession to the EUtrend (%)




Support for Montenegro's membership in NATO - %






Support for Montenegro's membership in NATO - trend (%)




On whom should Montenegro rely in its foreign policy -(%)






On whom should Montenegro rely in its foreign policy - trend (%)






What would be your first and what your second choice, regarding the Government's priorities in foreign policy- %






Foreign policy orientation – index






Priorities of domestic policy problems – index










What is your attitude toward the implementation of the forthcoming census -%



The Census should be conducted regularly this year



Serbs and Montenegrins used to be the same, and then over time. Serbs and Montenegrins became separate nations


Montenegrins have always been ethnically, historically and nationally special and should not be equated with Serbs




How would you declare yourself ethnically / nationally if the census were held now-%






Correlation of the previous and upcoming census regarding national declaration





I support the of oil and gas drilling activities in the Montenegrin sea


